

Session Meeting Notes

During the May 18th Session meeting, the following items were covered:

- While reviewing the financial report it was noted that our year-to-date offering income is down compared to previous years. Information will be provided in future newsletters to make members aware of this concern and its impact on our future financial status.
- A committee was formed to make contact with a potential transitional pastor who is retired and may be interested in helping Centre in that position.
- After a lengthy discussion of the current CDC guidelines and the Presbytery's recommendations, it was the consensus of the Session that, for the month of June, all members who are able will be encouraged to get the Covid-19 vaccine and all attendees to worship in the sanctuary will be treated equally by asking everyone to wear masks to show their concern for themselves and others. This policy will be reviewed on a monthly basis but will likely be in place until Pennsylvania lifts the masking order (when the adult vaccination rate in the state reaches 70%). Singing with masks on will be allowed. Special services in the sanctuary may be held following our face masking order. Receptions will not be permitted. Regarding Vacation Bible School—masks will be optional for children and vaccinated adults, required for non-vaccinated adults, and we recommend that adult volunteers be vaccinated.
- It was agreed to move to the Summer Worship time of 10:00am beginning June 6, 2021.
- Although there is concern that some members may not return to in-person church because of the convenience of the live streaming of our services, it was agreed that the hybrid church will no doubt continue as it offers the opportunity to worship with us to both local and long distant people who cannot attend in person. Recent broadcasting problems are being addressed and additional training with our equipment provider is planned in June.
- Session approved a Summer Reading Plan for children and adults proposed by Sunday School Superintendent Betsy McPherson.

Trustees Update

1. The 42 inch high railings on the front porch and steps have passed the building code inspection.

2. The final Lexan panels have been installed for the big dormer in front of the church . The ladders have been removed from the roof. (see photo on right)

3. The trustees are working on solving the problem of the bird nest debris on the front porch. Also, the porch floor and the stone wall will be cleaned.

4. Progress at the manse:

- a. Bathtubs have been installed in both bathrooms.
- b. New subflooring has been installed in the dining room.
- c. The flooring for the house has been selected and ordered.
- d. The brick wall in the old office has been painted white and all new 2x4 wall studs have been installed.



Mission Spotlight - Seitz family serving in Taiwan

Dear friends,

In a graduate school seminar taught by Dr. Luis Rivera-Pagán, I learned the word "xenophilia," literally, "love of the foreign." We know its antonym, "xenophobia," much better, and one of the main debates of our age is whether pluralism is possible, sustainable, or desirable. Divisions are often painfully visible.

Sometimes being different is exhausting or confusing. Still, for Christians I believe xenophilia certainly fits with many of our biblical teachings: 'love your neighbor,' 'the stranger shall be as your neighbor,' 'show your love for the alien,' and on and on. In the Bible, there's often a reciprocity to this love; you were aliens and so you shall treat the alien well. Strangers aren't just tolerated or accepted; we are to love the stranger.

I find myself deeply grateful for the Taiwanese community and its witness. Highlights of the last months have been talking to Taiwanese missionaries back from Southeast Asia, sharing about our work online with Cincinnati Presbytery, meeting with other missionaries in Taiwan (from Thailand, Korea, and Wales), and enjoying the Lunar New Year break. Emily invited kids from one of the churches where we serve to go ice skating at Taipei Arena during the long holiday as a chance to have fellowship outside of church. Kind of fun that there is a place for us to ice skate on a sub-tropical island! Emily also took the kids hiking in several different parts of northern Taiwan, and while we live in the city, we're also grateful for this natural beauty. Through our children, we've learned to love Taiwan in some of the ways they love Taiwan, through its treats (boba tea is a current favorite), its people (the kids they play with at school and in the parks), and its places (forests and beaches and cities). After more than ten years here, this once strange holiday (Lunar New Year) is also our holiday and we're grateful to share it with others.

My prayer...is that in the intractable difference of our societies you can also love those who are very different. We are also grateful for the ways you show your love, through prayer and encouragement and invitations to share about this place we love.

Update on Pastoral Search Process

With the retirement of Pastor Don Hackett set to begin in July 2021, our pastoral search process has begun.

Here's what is happening now and in the future:

Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC)

1. Those elected to serve on the PNC include: Elders – Donald Wilson, Mary Linkous, Deacon – Marg Graybeal, Trustee – Hugh Scott, Women of Centre – Jackie Smithson, Youth – Ian McPherson, Member at Large – Kristina Wilt.

2. The PNC is preparing a <u>Ministry Information Form</u> (MIF) that will be approved by Session and the Donegal Presbytery Committee On Ministry (COM). This information about our church is provided to potential candidates.

3. Our Personnel Committee and Treasurer are preparing a financial review, pastor position description, pastor search budget, compensation package range, and other documents for Session and the Presbytery's Connecting our Ministries Commission (COM) review and approval.

4. The PNC will advertise the position, receive resumes, interview candidates, select a candidate for vote, and present the terms of call to Session for approval.

5. The candidate will meet with the Presbytery of Donegal's COM to discuss the fit between the candidate and Center and Examination Commission for membership in the presbytery.

6. The candidate will be introduced to the congregation in various ways.

7. A congregational meeting will be held to vote on whether or not to request that the Presbyter of Donegal install the candidate as Centre's next pastor.

8. The PNC will oversee the welcome and ongoing support of the approved candidate.

Please pray for our PNC and for wisdom as we discern our direction and leadership for the future.
